- Expansion of the German Mineral Resources Agency (DERA) with Chambers

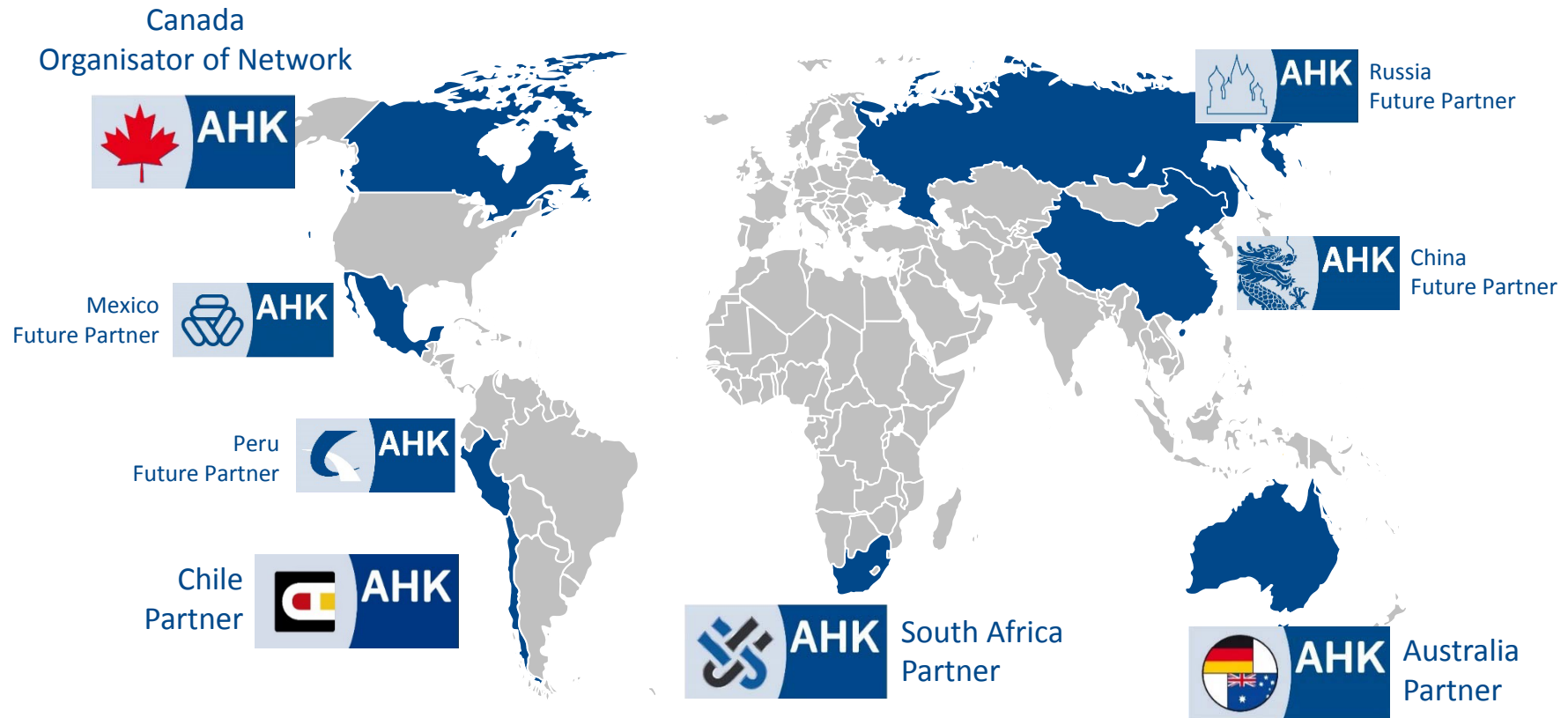
